



Terence Koh: bee chapel

Former art-world bad-boy Terence Koh returns from an upstate sabbatical with "bee chapel" at Andrew Edlin. A departure from Koh's days selling gold-plated feces to dimwitted collectors, the installation aims at the bucolic: Koh promises an apple tree, floors covered in topsoil, a beehive connected to the outside world via acrylic tube, plus mixedmedia collages and a sound work. At two this afternoon, the day of the show's opening, the artist leads a procession from 50 East 1st Street to the gallery; participants are asked to bear signs reading "NOW." Though it's unclear whether the new work positions Koh as an artmarket critic or abettor, this spectacle shouldn't disappoint.
